To Become a YPRC Trip Leader or Assistant See the guidelines below:

PROCESS AND QUALIFICATIONS

- 1. Inform the Safety Committee that you would like to be a Trip Leader or assistant
- 2. Pass the YPRC Trip Leader assessment.
- 3. Pass YPRC Local Knowledge test verbal questions
- 4. Assistant trip leaders, Assist on two YPRC kayak trips with 2 different certified instructor and /or Trip Leaders and have them pass you.
- 5. Trip Leaders; Co-lead at least three kayak trips (These trips must run with at least one trip assistant and three participants. Trip leaders in training must be evaluated by at least two different YPRC safety committee members or by two ACA Level 2 instructors.

Co-leading means existing YPRC trip leader oversees and supervises a trip leader in training who will:

- Create a float plan
- Post the event on the calendar
- Evaluate all potential paddlers' skill level for trip participation,
- Execute the trip (including set-up and clean-up)

NOTE: All applicants for trip leader and assistant trip leader are subject to final approval by the Safety Committee.
